MATERIALS

Yardages based on 42" wide unwashed fabric. Prewashing fabric may require additional yardage.

- 3/8 yd Black Eyes Y1025-3
- 1/4 yd Yellow Pumpkin Toss Y1024-10
- 1/4 yd Black Pumpkin Toss Y1024-3
- 1/4 yd Blue Ghosts Y1023-31
- 1/4 yd Yellow Eyes Y1025-9
- 1/4 yd Orange Eyes Y1025-37
- 1/4 yd Blue Swirl Y1022-31
- 1/4 yd Black/White Swirl Y1022-3
- 1 yd Dark Gray Swirl Y1022-7 (sashing & binding)
- 1 yd Orange Ghosts Y1023-37 (outer border)
- 2 1/2 yds Backing of choice:

CUT THE FABRICS

WOF = Width of Fabric
LOF = Length of Fabric

From Black Eyes cut:
12 - 6" x 6" squares - pocket background

From each of the 7 quarter yard pieces cut:
6 - 7" x 7" squares (total of 42 squares)

From Dark Gray Swirl cut:
5 - 2 1/2" x WOF strips - binding

9 - 2" x WOF strips;
From 2 of those strips cut 8 - 2" x 8 1/2" rectangles -vertical sashing

From Orange Ghosts cut:
5 - 6" x WOF strips

DIRECTIONS for "HIDDEN CANDY" QUILT

Assemble the Pockets:


1. Choose two contrasting 7" squares from the 42 squares. Place the two squares right sides together and draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of one of the squares. Stitch a 1/4-inch seam on both sides of the drawn line. Cut the square in half on the drawn line to yield two half-square triangle units. *Fig 1*
2. Fold each half-square triangle unit in half, wrong sides together, along the seam line. Press one unit with one fabric on top; press the other unit with the second fabric on top, so that the two units are opposite. *Fig 2*
3. Roll down the seam line along the bias edge to create a scallop. Press. Topstitch close to the curved edge. Repeat to pair 5 more combinations of 7" squares to create a total of 12 pockets. *Fig 3*

Assemble the Pocket Blocks:

1. Set a 6" Black Eyes background square on point; center a pocket on the square so that three of the points match. Baste the pocket in place. Trim tips of pockets. *Fig 4*
2. Choose two matching 7" squares for the corner triangles of each pocket block. Trim each down to 6" square and cut in half on the diagonal to yield four triangles.
3. Sew a triangle to each side of the pocket block, sandwiching the pocket in the seam. Press the triangles out. Make 12. Blocks should measure 8 1/2" x 8 1/2". *Fig 5*

Assemble the Quilt:

1. Lay out the 12 pocket blocks in four rows of three blocks with the 2" x 8 1/2" vertical sashing strips in between. Sew three pocket blocks and two sashing strips together in a row, pressing seams toward the sashing strips. Repeat for a total of 4 block rows.
2. Measure the width of the block rows and cut 5 horizontal 2" sashing strips. Stitch the sashing strips to the top, bottom and between each block row. Press all seams toward the sashing.
3. Measure the length of the block rows and cut 2 vertical 2" sashing strips. Stitch to the left and right edges; press toward the sashing.
4. Measure the width of the quilt center and cut two 6" outer border strips. Stitch to the top and bottom sides of the quilt. Press toward the borders.
5. Stitch three 6" WOF outer border strips together end to end. Measure the length of the quilt and cut two borders for this measurement. Stitch the borders to the quilt sides; press toward the borders.
6. Layer, baste and quilt as desired. Create the binding strip and stitch to the quilt.



MATERIALS

Yardages based on 42" wide unwashed fabric. Prewashing fabric may require additional yardage.

2/3 yard Framed Blocks Y1021-3

- 1/8 yard Orange Eyes Y1025-37
- 1/8 yard Dark Gray Swirl Y1022-7
- 1/8 yard Black Pumpkin Y1024-3
- 1/8 yard Blue Ghost Y1023-31
- 5/8 yard Blue Swirl Y1022-31
- 1 1/4 yard of 1 1/4" cotton webbing

Two 16 x 17-inch pieces of batting or fusible fleece

CUT THE FABRICS

WOF = Width of Fabric
LOF = Length of Fabric

From the framed blocks, cut two images 1/4" beyond (outside of) the checkerboard edge on the top and bottom; 5/8" outside the checkerboard on the left and right sides. Finished cut size is 9 7/8" x 10 1/2". One image is for the tote front; one image is for the tote back.

Orange Eyes
Cut two: 2 1/2" x 9 7/8"

Dark Gray Swirl
Cut two: 2 1/2" x 9 7/8"

Black Pumpkin
Cut two: 2 1/2" x 14 1/2"

Blue Ghost
Cut two: 2 1/2" x 14 1/2"

For bag lining and handles:


Blue Swirl
Cut two: 13 7/8" x 14 1/2"
and
Cut two: 3" x 20"

1 1/4" cotton webbing
Cut two 20-inch pieces


DIRECTIONS for TREAT TOTE

Prior to starting this project, please check our web site for any updates: www.clothworks.com.

1. Sew the 2 1/2" x 9 7/8" Orange Eyes rectangle to the top of one block piece; press seam out. Sew the 2 1/2" x 9 7/8" Dark Gray Swirl rectangle to the bottom of the block piece; press seam out.
2. Sew the 2 1/2" x 14 1/2" Black Pumpkin rectangle to the left side of the block section; press seam out. Sew the 2 1/2" x 14 1/2" Blue Ghost rectangle to the right side of the block section; press seam out.
3. Repeat steps one and two to make a second block section.
4. Layer each block section on a piece of 16" x 17" batting. Quilt in the ditch around each block piece. Trim batting even with edge of each block section.
5. Place the two quilted block sections right sides together and stitch along the side seams. Trim batting from the seams; press seams open.
6. Sew the bottom seam of the block sections together; trim batting from the seams and press open.
7. To make the bag bottom square, place the bag side seam right sides together with the bag bottom seam; match seams and pin. Stitch across the triangles 2 1/4" from the tip. Check to make sure the seams line up and stitch again to reinforce the corner. Trim the triangle 1/4" from the seam line.
8. To make the handles, fold one 3" x 20" Blue Swirl in half lengthwise and sew along the long edge. Turn the rectangle right side out and press with the seam centered in the back of the rectangle. Attach a large safety pin to the end of one of the 20" cotton webbing pieces; thread the webbing through the handle tube. Topstitch the long edges of the handle. Repeat to make two.
9. Sew the two 13 7/8" x 14 1/2" Blue Swirl lining side seams together; press. Sew the bottom seam of the lining together, leaving an opening in the middle for turning. Fold, stitch, and trim the corners as you did in step #6; press.
10. Place the handles 3" from the side seams on the right side of the lining. With the handle seams facing the lining, match the raw edges of handles to the lining. Pin in place; baste.
11. Place the bag and the bag lining right sides together, matching top edges and side seams; sew the top edge. Turn the bag right side out through the opening in the bottom seam; hand stitch the opening closed. Press. Topstitch 1/4" along the top edge of the bag to finish.
