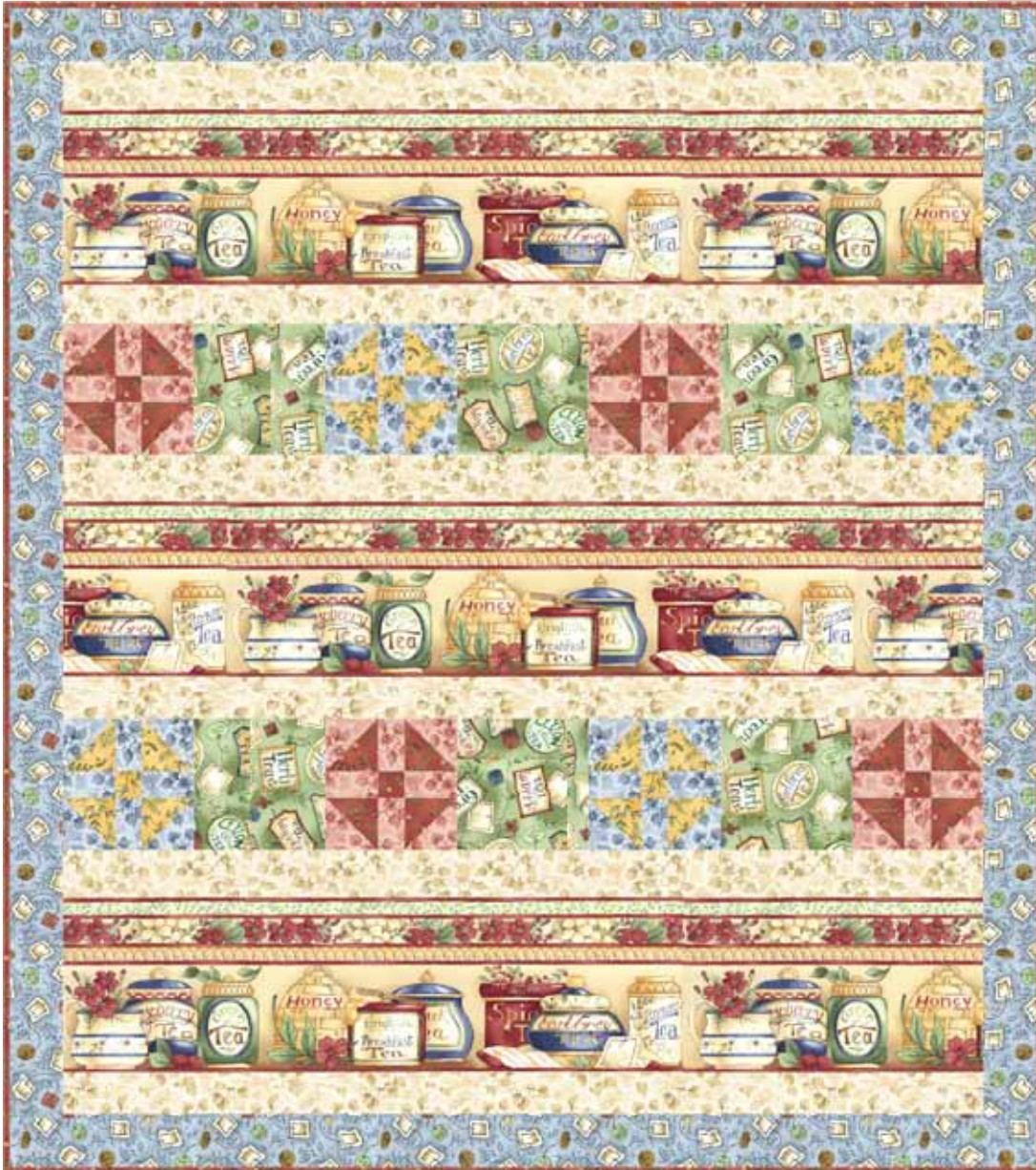

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Materials

Yardages based on 42" wide fabric

- 1 1/2 yard Tea Party Pictorial Stripe (Y0544-11)
- 1/4 yard Lt Red Tonal Floral (Y0545-4)
- 3/8 yard Tan Tonal Floral (Y0545-11)
- 1/4 yard Blue Tonal Floral (Y0545-30)
- 1/4 yard Green Labels (Y0547-24)
- 3/8 yard Blue Teabags (Y0548-30) (border)
- 1/2 yard Red Sprigs (Y0549-4) (includes binding)
- 1/4 yard Yellow Sprigs (Y0549-9)
- 1-3/8 yard backing of choice

Cut the Fabrics

WOF = Width of Fabric

LOF = Length of Fabric

From the Tea Party Pictorial Stripe cut:

3 – 8 1/2" x 35 1/2" strips (centering on the stripes of tea and flowers)

From the Lt Red Tonal Floral cut:

8 – 2 7/8" squares
16 – 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" rectangles

From the Tan Tonal Floral cut:

6 – 1 1/2" x 35 1/2" strips

From the Blue Tonal Floral cut:

8 – 2 7/8" squares
16 – 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" rectangles

From the Green Label cut:

6 – 5 1/2" squares

From the Blue Teabags cut:

4 – 2 1/2" x WOF strips (border)

From the Red Sprigs cut:

5 – 2 1/2" x WOF strips (binding)
8 – 2 7/8" squares
4 – 1 1/2" squares

From the Yellow Sprigs cut:

8 – 2 7/8" squares
4 – 1 1/2" squares

Making the Red Shoofly Blocks

1. Pencil a diagonal line from corner to opposite corner on the back of eight lt red tonal floral 2 7/8" squares as shown in diagram 1.
2. Pair right sides together a lt red tonal floral 2 7/8" square and a red sprigs 2 7/8" square. Sew a 1/4" seam along both sides of the penciled line.
3. Cut the square into two halves on the penciled line and carefully press open the half square triangles. Repeat to make a total of sixteen lt red tonal floral/red sprigs half square triangles. (Diagram 1)

4. Layout (as shown in Diagram 2) four lt red tonal /red sprigs half square triangles, four lt red floral 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" rectangles and one 1 1/2" red sprigs square.

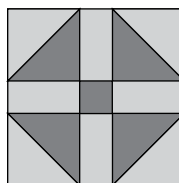

5. Sew the units into three rows, sew the three rows together and press the block. Repeat to make four 5 1/2" red shoofly blocks.
6. Repeat the previous instructions to make four 5 1/2" yellow shoofly blocks using the blue floral and yellow sprigs units.

Sewing the Quilt Center Together

1. Sew a tan tonal floral 1 1/2" x 35 1/2" strip to both long sides of each tea party pictorial stripe 8 1/2" x 35 1/2" strip as shown in Diagram 3. Press the seams towards the wide center strip.

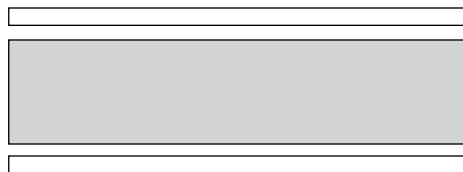

2. Sew into a row two red shoofly blocks, two yellow shoofly blocks and three green tea label 5 1/2" squares as shown in the quilt picture. Press the seams toward the unpieced squares. Repeat to make the second row as shown in the quilt picture.
3. Sew the tea party border rows and the block rows together as shown in the quilt picture. Press the quilt top, pressing the seam allowances away from the block rows.

Adding the Border

1. Measure the length of the quilt center and trim two blue tea bag border strips to that length. Sew to the left and right sides of the quilt center. Press the seams outward.
2. Measure the width of the quilt center and trim two blue tea bag border strips to that length. Sew to the top and bottom sides of the quilt center. Press the seams outward.
